HIGHLAND AFFORDABLE HOUSING, a Truro-based, all-volunteer organization works with its neighbors to create decent affordable housing on the Outer Cape, where median family incomes hover at \$70,000 and median home prices are over \$500,000. The HOMELESS PREVENTION COUNCIL was established in 1991 to assist families on the Lower Cape at risk of becoming homeless, the majority of whom are families with long-established roots in the community. In 2009 our case load increased 32% from 621 to 822. 1934 individuals, including 850 children were saved from becoming homeless. Our free services include: Case Management, Direct Assistance, Financial Budgeting & Counseling, and Networking with other Support Services. Contributions make up 90% of our annual income. 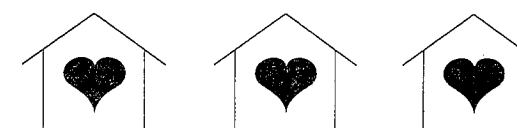

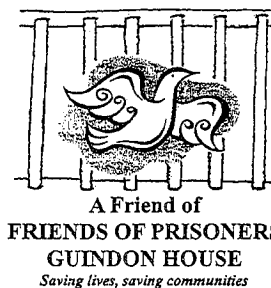
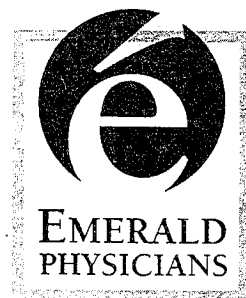
